## S.A.F.E. Plan: Guiding Principles



### S.A.F.E. (Strategic Action for Flexible Education)

- 1. Safety Maintain safe, healthy working and learning conditions
- 2. Equity Provide access to quality instruction, no matter what learning environment a parent chooses
- 3. Communication Provide clear and concise communication to build unity and trust
- 4. Academics Mitigate loss of learning time and provide ample learning opportunities to ensure students remain on track
- 5. Social & Emotional Learning Implement SEL practices to better support the wide range of student needs
- 6. Funding Prioritize spending to ensure equity District-wide
- 7. Partnerships Stakeholders must remain wiling to adapt and align their services and supports to meet the needs of students





# WHICH OPTION ARE YOU MOST LIKELY TO CHOOSE IN 2020-21?
















# PHYSICAL SCHOOL (IN-PERSON INSTRUCTION) OR VIRTUAL/ONLINE INSTRUCTION?

# FACTORS INFLUENCING REOPENING PREFERENCES

















## HOW IMPORTANT IS EACH FACTOR?










## Reimagining Accountability


