# Option 1: If your parent organization will raise money for your school

#### First year parent organization requirements

- > Proof of current Tennessee Nonprofit Corporation or
- > Proof of charitable foundation status (501C3) or
- > Proof of current subordinate membership with a charitable foundation (501C3)
- > Must complete online registration and be approved by the SCS District

\*\*\* As a subordinate member, a group is considered a foundation or fund under the parent organization's name for a designated fee and has the benefit of utilizing the parent organization's 501(c)(3) charitable donation status and exemption from TN sales tax

#### Returning parent organization requirements

- > Proof of current Tennessee Nonprofit Corporation or
- > Proof of charitable foundation status (501C3) or
- > Proof of current subordinate membership with a charitable foundation (501C3)
- ➤ Meeting minutes from last school year (1st, mid-year, & last meeting)
- > Statement of total revenues & disbursements from previous school year
- ➤ Must complete online registration and be approved by the SCS District
