

LEADERSHIP TRANSITION AT MSCS | WELCOME INTERIM SUPERINTENDENT RODERICK RICHMOND, EDD

During a special call meeting earlier this month, the Memphis-Shelby County Schools Board of Education made a difficult but necessary decision to end the employment contract with Dr. Marie Feagins. We made this decision based on differences in leadership we could not overcome.

The Board also voted to appoint Roderick Richmond, EdD, as interim superintendent. Dr. Richmond is a seasoned educator. He has been in education for over 30 years, serving as a Chief Academic Officer, Deputy Superintendent, Chief of School Operations, Principal, Assistant Principal, teacher, and, most recently, Transformation Officer. His extensive background and proven commitment to education make him well-equipped to guide our district during this transition.

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Selecting Dr. Richmond as our interim superintendent is a step in the right direction. We know he is up for the task and loves working for MSCS. We look forward to working with him to continue moving this district forward.

Transitions in leadership can bring uncertainty, but they also bring new opportunities for growth and improvement. We are committed to working collaboratively with the interim superintendent to ensure a smooth transition, clear priorities, and an unwavering focus on student success.

DISTRICT 2 HIGHLIGHTS NATALIE MCKINNEY, BOARD MEMBER

During the Fall 2024 semester, Board Member Natalie McKinney spent time visiting schools and talking to school leaders, teachers, students, and parents as she surveyed the District 2 landscape. During these visits, she learned that every stakeholder is committed to ensuring every student has a learning environment that is safe, well-maintained, and welcoming. McKinney also engaged in various events, including Hispanic Heritage Month events, chess tournaments, and more. She surveyed the "wants and needs" of school leaders and engaged students, teachers, parents, and community stakeholders interested in making our students' educational experience state-of-the-art and world-class. Here's some of what she learned:

- Students are seeking solutions to extra-curricular costs and funding disparities.
- Teachers feel as though their teaching environment varies depending on the building.
 They also have funding concerns, related to equipment and supplies needed to provide the best possible educational experience and some concerns about curriculum and instruction.
 However, teachers are generally enjoying the experience.
- Principals from various schools have shared their wants and needs, including upgrades to school facilities, incentives for students and teachers, and support for classroom instruction.
- Parents have some concerns about district communications and facilities, and they have offered solutions.
- Immigrant parent groups want improved access to interpretation service, opportunities, and ways for the District to connect with them.
