2025–2026 PRE-K ENROLLMENT

Enrollment is now open for our Head Start/Pre-K program. Every year, students who attend an MSCS Early Childhood Program score higher in Kindergarten readiness and outperform peers on District goals for foundational skills, literacy and more.
