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#### Lesson 9

**Phonics:** Review Short e

Blends with s: st, sl, sn, sm, sw, str, sc, sp, sk, scr Decodables: "Step Up!", "Splat! Splat!", "Nuts for Ben and Jen", "Miss Tess Was Still" Fluency: Accuracy – Word Reading

## Content

**Short Vowel Rule:** When there is one **vowel** in a word, either at the beginning or between two consonants, it usually has the **short vowel** sound.

Accuracy is the ability to read words in a text correctly.

**Consonant blends** are a set of two or three consonant letters that retain their sound when they are pronounced. Blends are found at the beginning (initial) or end (final) of a word.

### Content

**Final blends** are a combination of two or three consonants letters found at the end of a word. When pronounced, they retain their sound.

**Stress** refers to the different tones readers place on particular words to reflect the meaning of the text, as it would occur in oral language.
