



## Ed-Fi Dashboard Use Cases

### Teacher

**Title:** Using Student Level Data to Prepare for Parent Teacher Conferences

**Role:** Juwon Robinson, 7th Grade Science Teacher at Shabazz Middle School

**Background:** Mr. Robinson is a 7th grade science teacher at Shabazz Middle School. He is preparing for upcoming parent/teacher conferences. To keep parents informed of their student's progress, Mr. Robinson is reviewing each of his students' assessment results, grades, attendance, and discipline incidents. He plans on sharing these data with parents in their upcoming meeting. He believes by sharing all of this information with parents, they can work together to improve or further the success of each student.

**Usage Scenario:**

- Mr. Robinson plans to use the Ed-Fi Dashboards and any supplementary resources to discuss student data, progress, and work.
- Mr. Robinson logs in to the Ed-Fi Academic Dashboard.
- In preparation for parent/teacher conferences, he will focus his time going through the following sub-tabs in the system:
  - Attendance and Discipline
  - State Assessments
  - Grades and Credits
- As the meeting begins with the parent(s), he pulls up their **student's page** to review the student's data.
- Mr. Robinson confirms the **contact information**. If it is not correct, Mr. Robinson records the correct information and passes it along to the appropriate staff member to update SMS.
- Then he reviews the **Attendance and Discipline**, **State Assessment**, and **Grades and Credits tabs** with the parent(s). The dashboards provide a high-level overview along with detailed information during this conversation; he also has supplementary resources to support the data.
- With these data, the parent(s) and Mr. Robinson identify successes and areas of improvement during the conference.

\* Note that while teachers are showing parents their student's page, they should not display other students' information or data.
