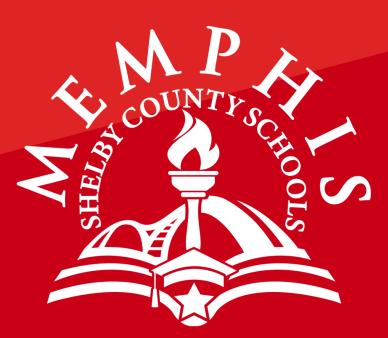
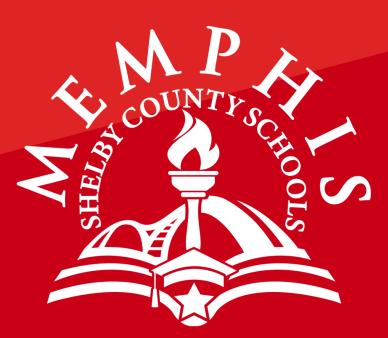
Infrastructure Discussions

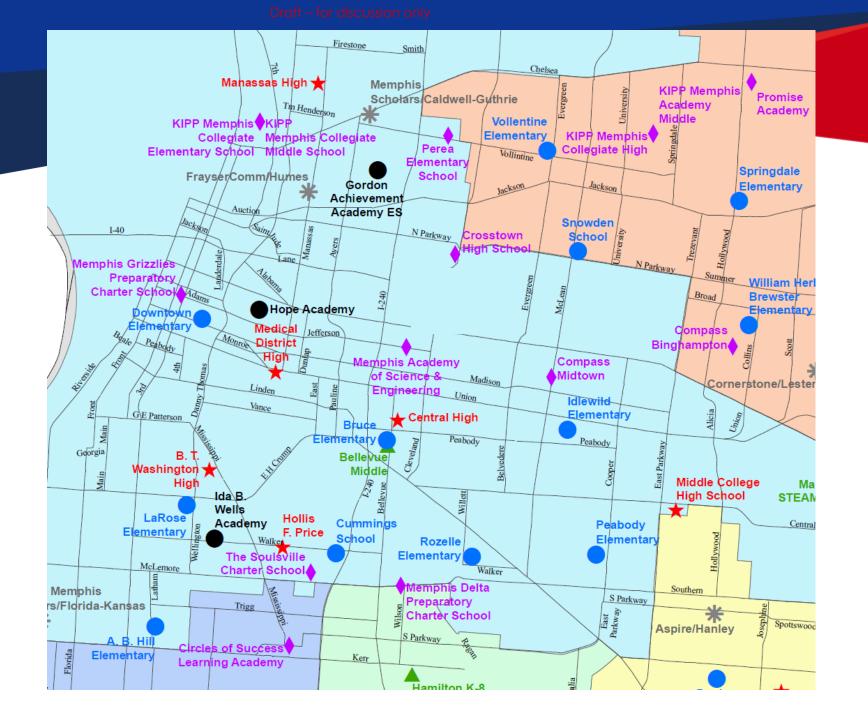

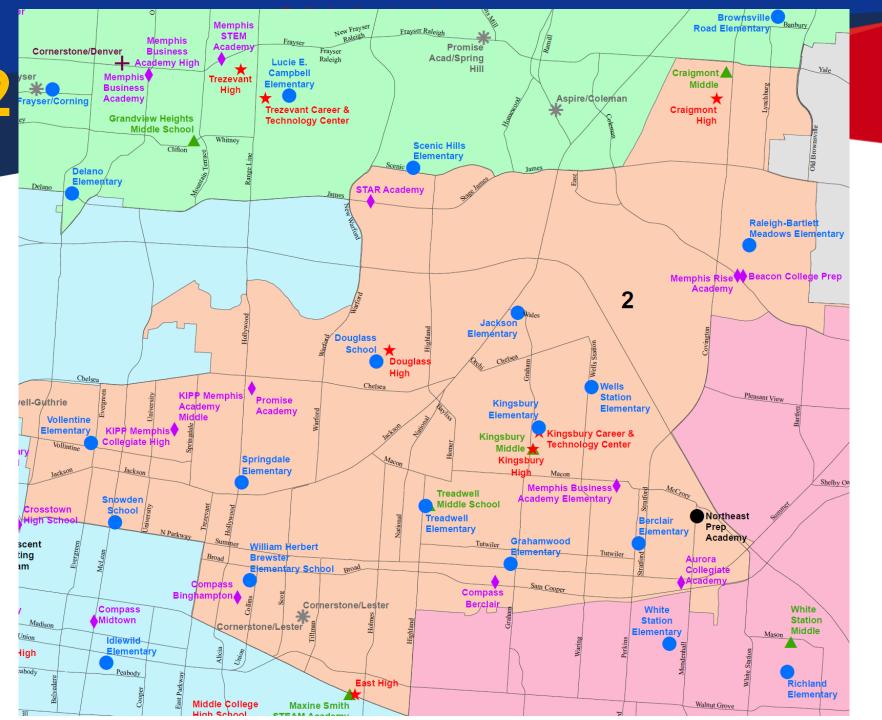
District #1 Assessments

District #2 rayser/Corning

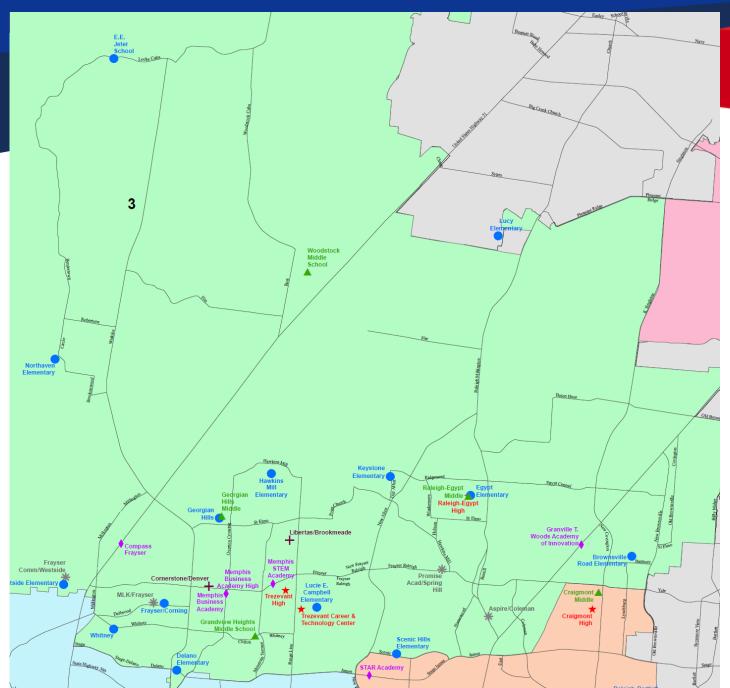

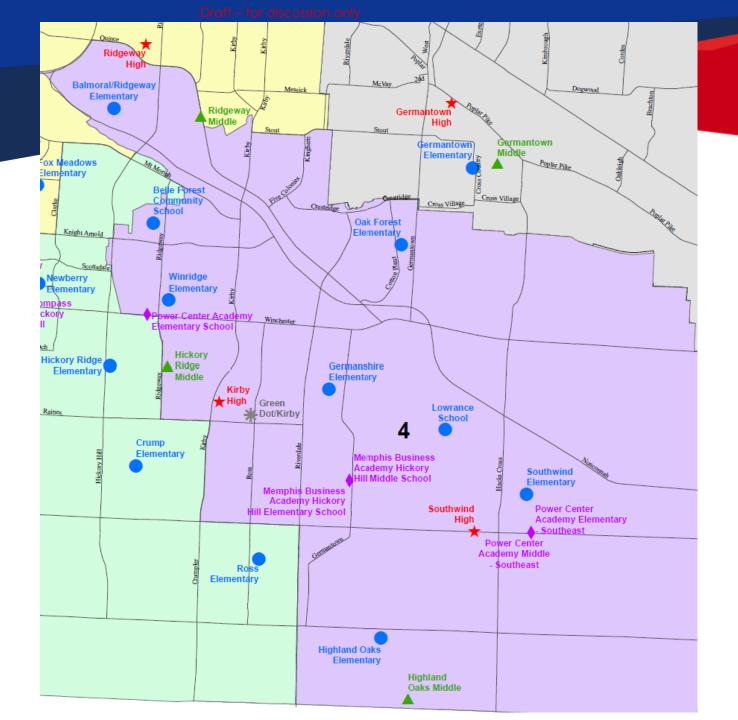

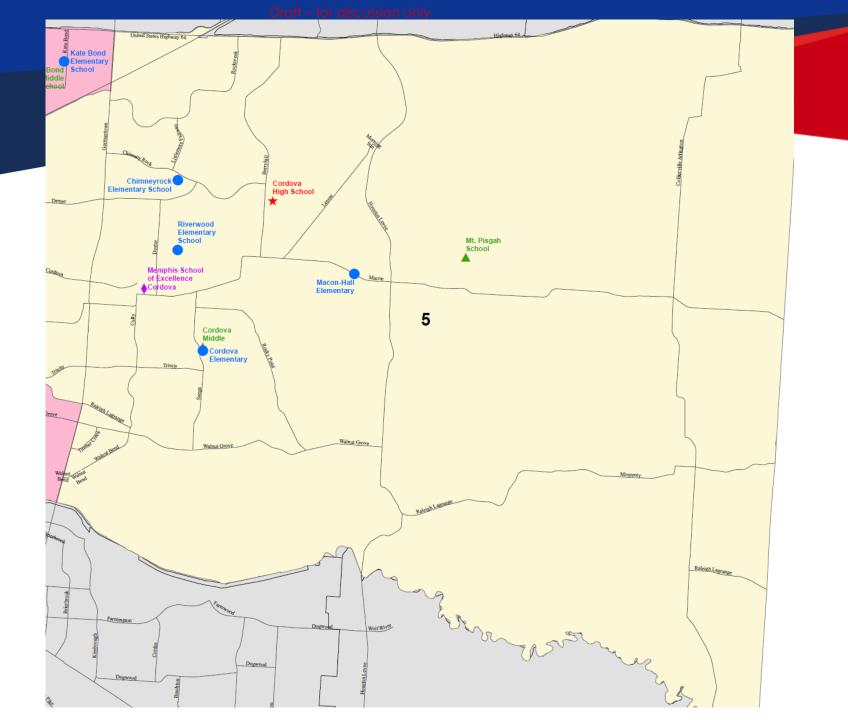

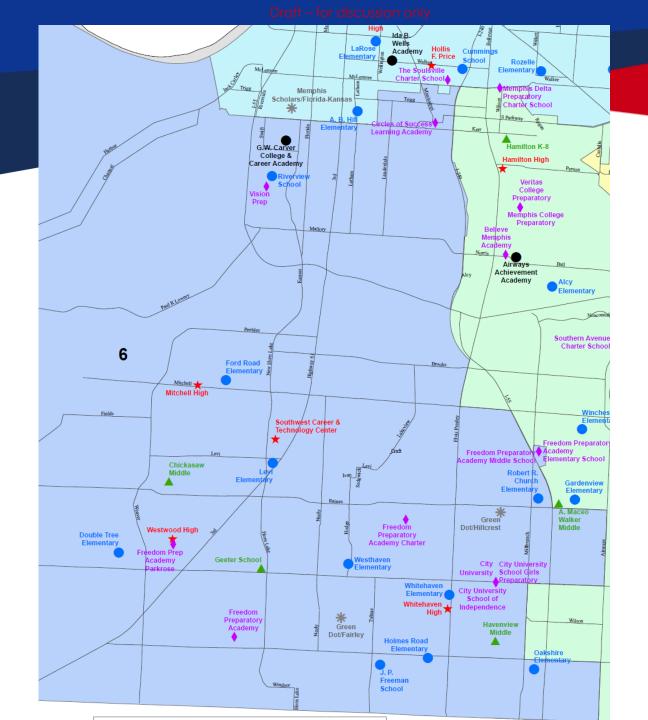

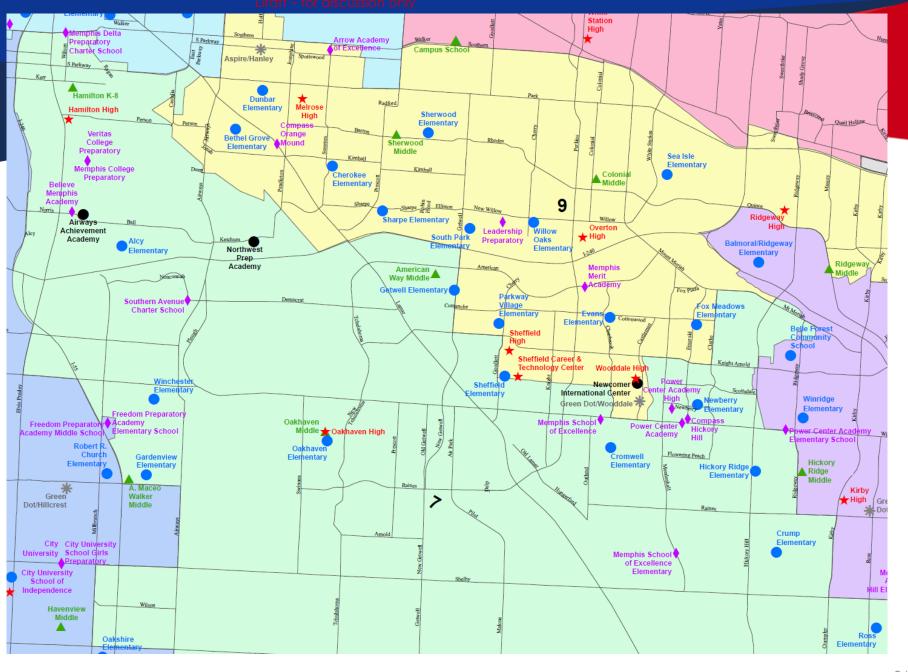

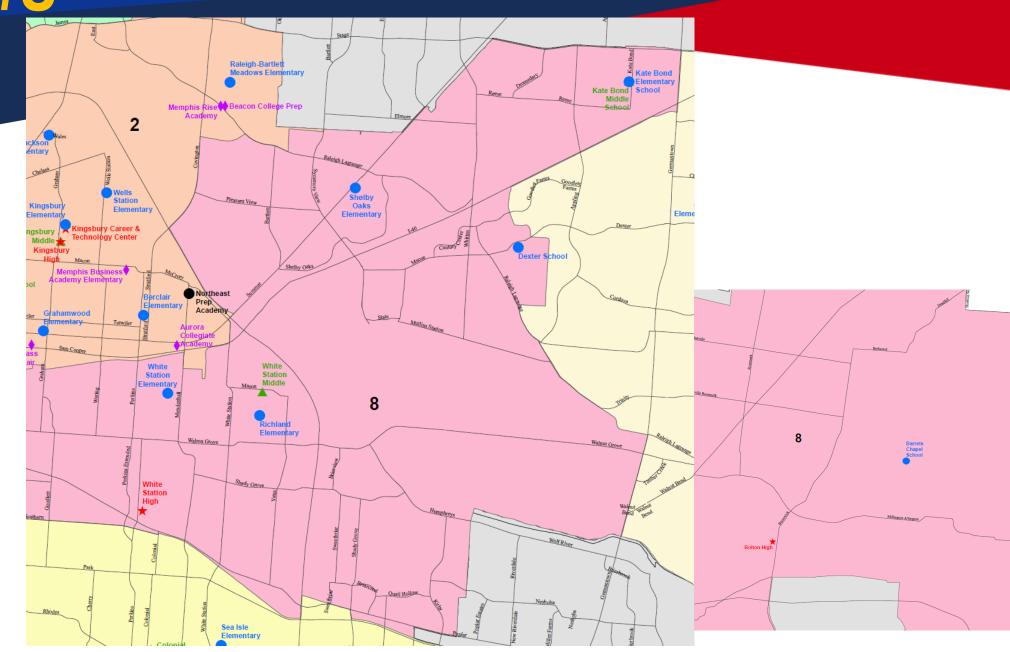

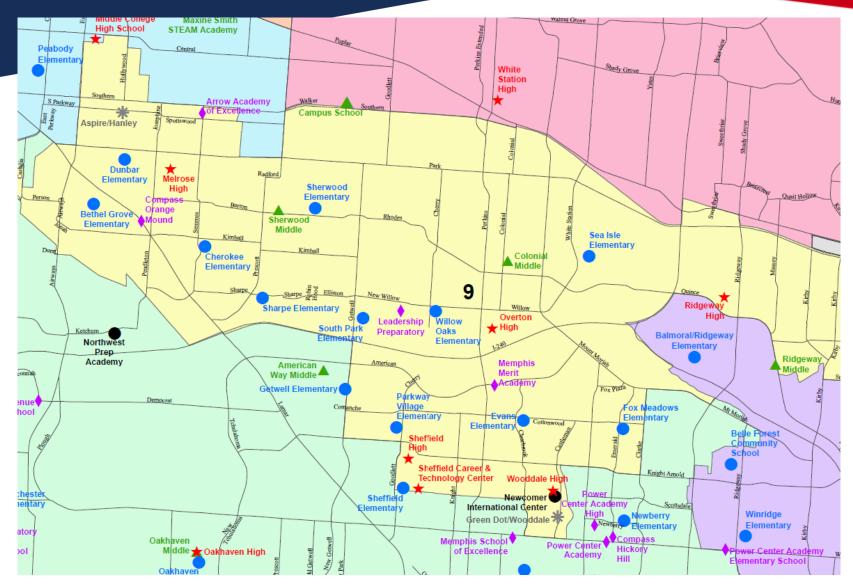
