History of JROTC in Area High Schools

Developing students since 1919

The history of Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (JROTC) units in area schools is as old as JROTC itself. After the passage of the National Defense Act of 1916, Memphis City Schools was approved to host units in January 1919. As the city schools system grew the number of units grew. During this time the instructors were active duty personnel assigned to the US Army Instructor Group (Junior ROTC), Memphis City Schools. Because there was a limit on the number of JROTC units funded by the Army, Memphis City Schools funded the establishment of National Defense Cadet Corps (NDCC) units at the district's black high schools in 1959. The ROTC Vitalization Act of 1964, caused the greatest time of growth. The NDCC units were converted to JROTC in 1966 and additional units were established in 1967, 1969 and 1970. At its peak there were 28 Army units with over 6,000 cadets enrolled. The 1964 Act also authorized the Air Force, Navy and Marine Corps to establish JROTC programs. The programs were opened to female enrollment in 1975. Currently there are one Air Force and twenty three Army JROTC units in the school district.
