<u>Wednesday August 5:</u> Middle Schools and High Schools <u>Thursday, August 6:</u> Elementary Schools and K-8 Schools (including middle grades in K-8 schools*) 8:00am-3:00pm; Registration begins at 7:30am

Theme: Seeing is Believing: What does a College and Career Ready Classroom Look Like? (And What do we Need to do to Make it Possible?)

Vision: We will show the WHAT and the HOW of focusing on College and Career Ready (CCR) through the lens of ELA and CLIP. We will demonstrate effective CLIP and CCR aligned classroom instruction and allow our teachers to see a strong model of the type of instruction we expect. Ultimately, we want our teachers to walk away believing that CCR-aligned instruction is possible and have a clear idea of how to implement key pieces in their classroom.

Focus: Consistent with the district focus on literacy at this point in the year (e.g., using close reading to understand the CCR vision, literacy foundation), we will be focused on the following priority skills:

- Pre-K Elementary Literacy will be focused on building vision, understanding the standards, systems and routines in the reading block (including foundations) and text complexity (e.g., read-alouds).
- Secondary Literacy will be focused on building vision, understanding the standards, complex worthwhile texts and fluency.
- Other Content Areas will likewise dive into standards, curriculum and frameworks and content-specific modeling.
- Student Support Positions (e.g., counselors, social workers) will be focused on CCR alignment, culture and climate (including PBIS) and resources.
- NOTE -- All teachers will engage in PD with their content area peers.

Logistics:

- Breakfast and lunch is on your own. No food will be served.

- There is insufficient parking for all sites. It is <u>expected</u> that teachers carpool to sites.

- Participants will be pre-registered in MLP for the appropriate day and site by the PD Department.
