School

White Station High School, located in the heart of East Memphis at Poplar and Perkins, is one of the best known and most popular Optional/magnet and traditional public schools in the city of Memphis. Ranked for 5 years as one of the top 1,200 public schools in the country, White Station offers traditional, honors, dual enrollment and advanced placement courses. The school also offers a wide range of other classes in business, music, the arts, vocational subjects, and R.O.T.C.

Accreditation

White Station is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. The school holds membership in The College Board, National Association for College Admission Counseling, CEEB, National Honor Society, Mu Alpha Theta, Thespian Society, and DECA. Students

White Station has an enrollment of 2,148 students in grades 9-12. The student body represents diverse ethnic, racial, religious, and socioeconomic groups with the following breakdown: 43% African-American, 9% Asian-American, 29% Caucasian, and 14% Hispanic American, and 5% other. Protestant, Catholic, Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, and Hindu students enhance the school's diversity.

Approximately 1,050 students or 48% are part of the Optional/ magnet program. Qualifications for acceptance to the Optional Program include a nationally normed test score of 80% or above in Reading, Language Arts and Math, and B's, with no more than one semester C, and satisfactory conduct and attendance. Students must maintain a minimum of a C average in every subject to remain in the program.

School Calendar

The school year is divided into two semesters of 90 days each. The school has two semesters each comprised of two nine-week grading periods.
