

Understanding of course requirements for Honors and AP courses

We are glad that your child has chosen rigorous, challenging and sometimes fun academic courses. Be sure to understand the following about these courses, as the workload will be heavy and the expectations high as the academic year unfolds.

Expectations:

Students are expected to do outside summer readings and assignments. Failure to do this summer work is not a reason to request opting out of the class. **They need to see their grade level guidance counselor for this information before school dismissal in May. They are also expected to see the current Honors or AP teacher for any other pertinent information that they may need over the summer preceding the course.**

Students are expected to put in the necessary time outside of class to study the material in a constructive studious manner. Preparation, and then the articulation (written or verbal) of this preparation, is the expectation in all Honor's and AP courses.

AP students are expected to pay for all fees associated with the AP Testing before they leave school for summer break preceding the Fall semester of the year they are registered for the AP course. AP fees this past year were \$86.00 (prices are subject to change, however, yearly).

Once the course verification form has a parental signature, the student is then committed to staying in the course for its entirety.
