POLICY DISCUSSION UNETEENTH AND DISTRICT HOLIDAYS

The Shelby County Schools recognizes certain days as holidays and pays employees for time off on these days in accordance with the eligibility requirements. However, certain employees (such as security employees) may be required to work on a holiday and will be paid in accordance with guidelines established by the Superintendent or designee. Pay for holidays observed by the District shall be based on the primary work schedule of the employee.

MEETING SUMMARY

On November 2, the Internal Board Operations (IBO) Committee met to discuss various updates including an overview of the Biennial Review Process, Policy Discussion of Juneteenth and District Holidays, ELL/SPED, and MWBE.

All full-time permanent twelve (12) month employees (exempt and non-exempt), except as otherwise provided in an employment contract, shall receive an additional designated paid holiday (Juneteenth) as indicated below:
