REPORT CARD UPDATE

In April of 2019, the School Board approved a revision to policy 5013: Promotion and Retention that defined the "Criteria for Success" 2nd graders must achieve to be promoted to the 3rd grade. Shelby County Schools launched the 3rd Grade Commitment in effort to raise awareness around this policy update and the importance that early literacy has on students' academic achievement.

To allow parents to track and monitor student progress, report cards will now display students' scores for those assessments that provide data towards the Criteria for Success.

Blend/jgment onsets and rimes

Mathematics K
Says in halfer words that we cannot know which is longer because part is hidden.
Uses the words longer than and shorter than correctly to compare
Arranges the strings to share an endpoint
States that length is being compared or how long the strings are
Says the 7 stick is longer than the 5 stick
Says the 5 stick is shorter than the 9 inch string
Says the two smaller sticks are the same as the 5 stick, (ex. 3 stick and 2 stick)
Uses the words heavier than and lighter than correctly to compare
Balances the scale with the pennies or cubes and says how many pennies or cubes are the same
States that weights is being compared or how much something weighs
Measures the object (rice) using the small container and identifies that there are four containers
States the capacity is being compared or how much the cup holds
Places squares on the paper to see if they fit
Shows there are not enough spoons for the bowls
Uses words more than and less than to compare the spoons and bowls
Shows which set is more and states that 6 is more than 4
Shows a set equal to 4
