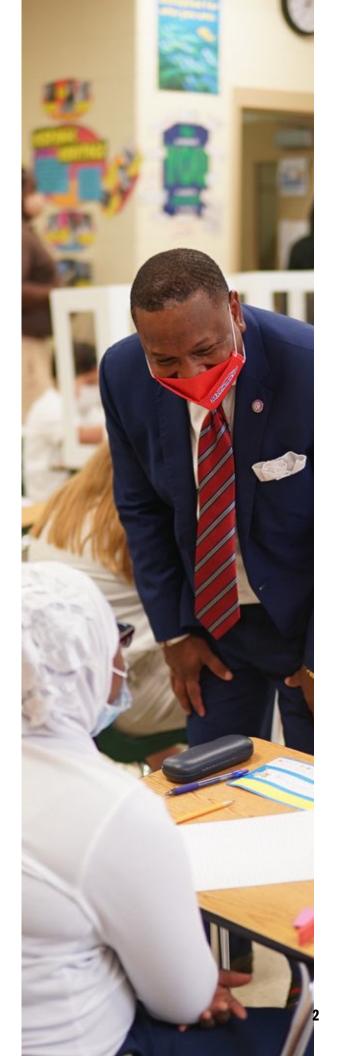

Purpose

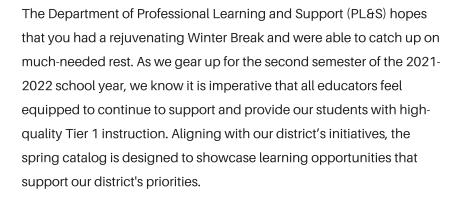

Shelby County Schools identifies student achievement as its highest priority. The Shelby County School Board voted on a revision to Policy 5013 Promotion and Retention. The revision was created to ensure we hold district and school leaders, teachers, and all stakeholders accountable towards ensuring SCS students have the necessary reading skills to be successful before they reach the third grade. Third grade has been identified as the year that students are no longer "learning to read" but they begin "reading to learn." If students are not reading on grade level by the time they reach the third grade, half of the curriculum they will be taught for the remainder of their school years will be incomprehensible. Students who meet 8 of 12 Criteria for Success at the conclusion of the second grade, will be eligible for promotion to the third grade.

The **3rd Grade Commitment** is a collaborative effort between schools, parents and community towards ensuring we all work together to best help SCS students reach reading readiness before the third grade.

Teacher Learning and Development

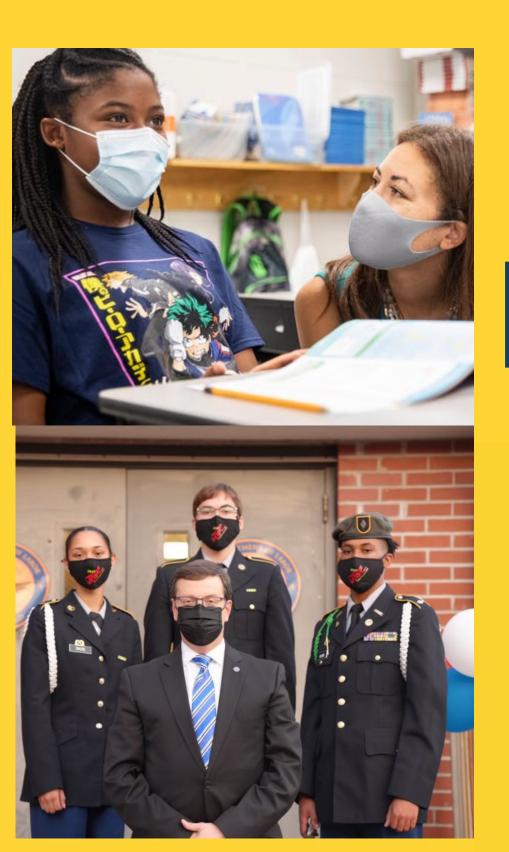

PROFESSIONAL LEARNING POLICY 4051

I. PURPOSE

To ensure that employees are offered meaningful elective and required professional learning opportunities that support student success and ensure district accountability

II. SCOPE

This policy applies to all employees.

Annually, all employees are required to successfully complete a formalized professional learning program which may be comprised of specific professional learning activities, hours, credits, courses, or classes etc.

Teachers shall be required to complete a minimum of 64 hours of district-developed and/or approved professional learning hours each year. The district shall provide opportunities such as online professional learning and district designated professional learning days to assist employees in completing their required professional learning.

Registering for courses

- All SCS employees should use PLZ to register for courses, this includes inperson, virtual and Canvas courses. This catalog includes learning opportunities for all SCS employees and is organized by department and includes pertinent course information.
- Once in PLZ you can search for courses by clicking the "Courses" tab, located at the top left.
- Next, enter the desired course number or course name found in this catalog in the box located under "Course Search".

Please note, most courses have a cap on the number of participants that can attend. It is important to register promptly in PLZ and verify course date and location prior to attending as courses are subject to change.

☐ Register for a TNCompass Account

- 1. Navigate to http://tncompass.org and click *Register Now*.
- 2. Provide your date of birth and social security number when prompted by the system.
- 3. Provide additional personal information when prompted.
- 4. Create a username and password. The username must be **a permanent email account that you access regularly**, as all communication regarding licensure will be sent to this email address.
- 5. Follow the prompts to verify your email account.

☐ Apply to Renew a License

- 1. Log in to your TNCompass account and click *My Educator Profile*.
- 2. Click the *Transaction* tab, then click Start a new transaction
- 3. Click Renew License.
- 4. Select the license to renew.
- 5. If you are renewing a license because you do not meet advancement criteria, you will see additional required tabs for verifying information based on the license type you are renewing.
- 6. To renew a professional license with 60 professional development points (PDPs), you must submit the PDPs in TNCompass with corresponding documentation. If you are employed in a Tennessee public school, the PDPs will be approved by your district. If you are not employed in a Tennessee public school, PDPs will be approved by the office of educator licensure and preparation (OELP).
- 7. Check the verification box at the bottom of each page and click Save & Continue.

- 8. On the Summary page, click Save & Continue >
- 9. Click Add Personal Affirmation and complete the Personal Affirmation.

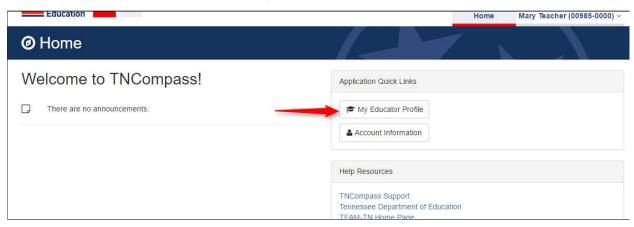

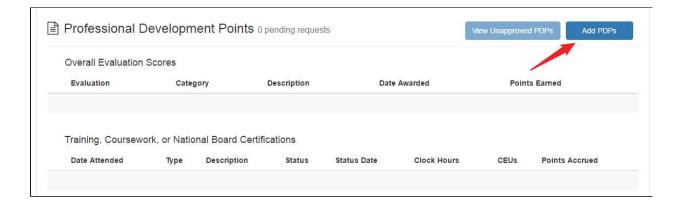


When the *Educator Profile* page displays, click *Licensure* tab.

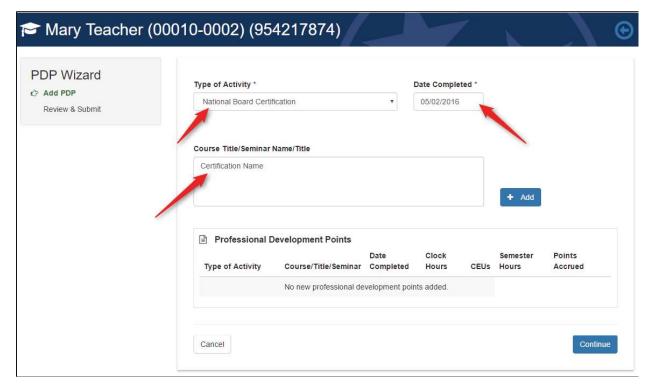


On the *Licensure* page, scroll to section for *Professional Development Points (PDPs*) and click the *Add PDPs* button.

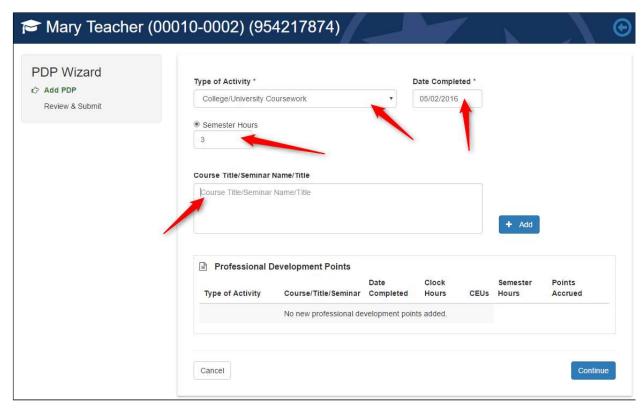




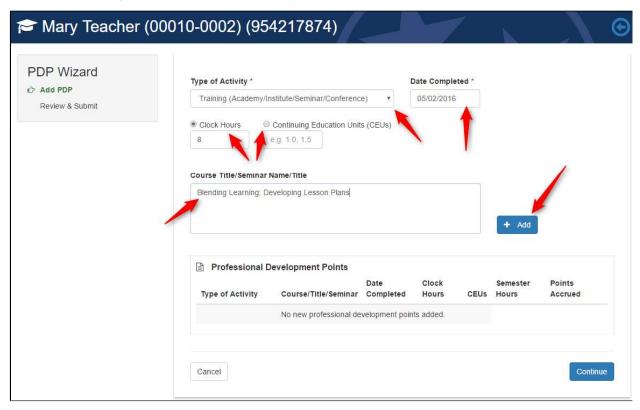

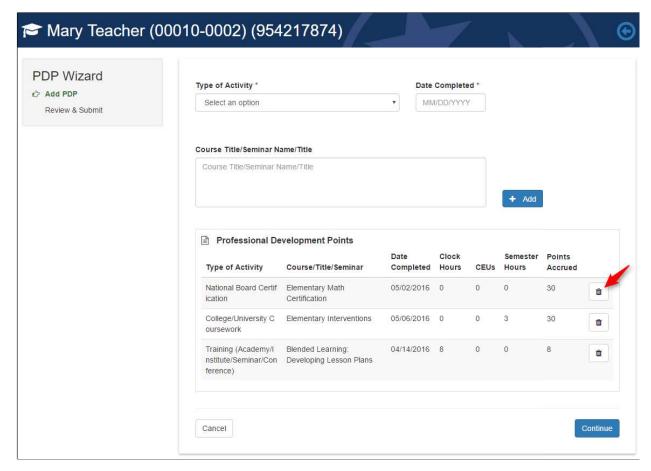


More than one activity can be entered for the PDP request.



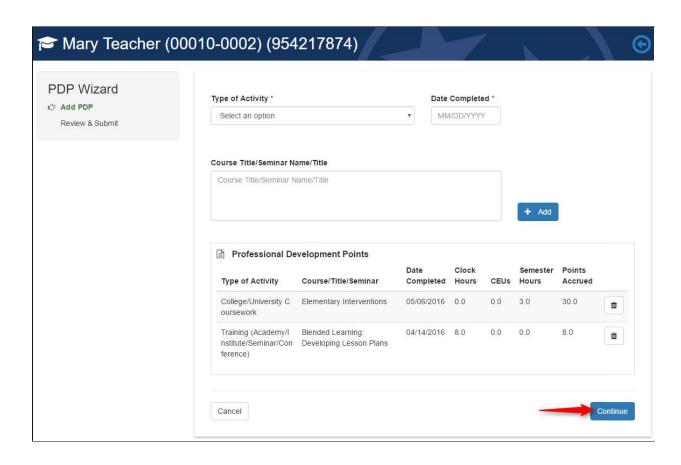
To remove an activity after it has been added, click on the trash can icon to delete the line item.



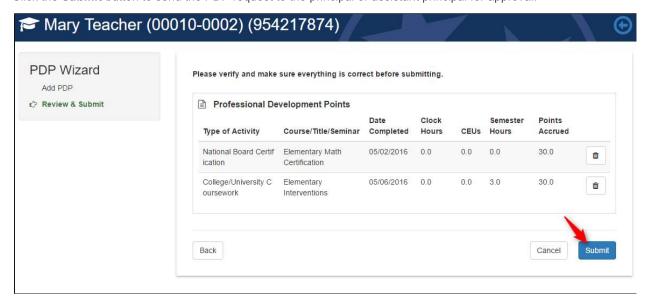


When the activity/activities appear in the list click the *Continue* button.
