



## Frequently Asked Questions About PreK

<p><b>How do I get my child registered for Pre-K/Head Start?</b></p>	<p>The online application will be available beginning March 8, 2021. After parents submit the online application, staff members will contact the parent to schedule an eligibility interview. The interview will be held by phone until further notice.</p> <p>Visit the website at <a href="http://www.scsk12.org/prek">www.scsk12.org/prek</a> to apply, for the list of required documents and for the most up-to-date information. <p><b>How old does my child have to be to apply for Pre-K?</b></p>	<p>For the 2021-22 school year, the child must be 4 years old by Aug. 15, 2021. If applying for Head Start, the child must be 3 years old by Aug. 15, 2021.</p>
<p><b>How do I submit the required documents?</b></p>	<p>Parents can submit the required documents by emailing them to <a href="mailto:prekregistration@scsk12.org">prekregistration@scsk12.org</a>. Parents will also receive an email from staff informing them of what documents are missing prior to the eligibility interview.</p>
<p><b>Where can my 3-year-old attend school?</b></p>	<p>We accept a limited number of 3-year-old children in our center-based classrooms and select school-based classrooms.</p>
<p><b>Are Head Start and PreK the same?</b></p>	<p>Shelby County Schools is the grantee for both Head Start and Pre-K.</p>
<p><b>What do I need to have for registration?</b></p>	<p>Eligibility interviews will occur by phone until further notice. Go to our website at <a href="http://www.scsk12.org/prek">www.scsk12.org/prek</a> to see a list of required documents.</p> <p>Parents can submit the required documents by emailing them to <a href="mailto:prekregistration@scsk12.org">prekregistration@scsk12.org</a>. Parents will also receive an email from staff informing them of what documents are missing prior to the eligibility interview.</p>
<p><b>Do I have to bring my child to registration?</b></p>	<p>The process will be online for the 2021-22 school year. Children do not need to be present during the eligibility interview.</p>
<p><b>Will they tell me if my child is accepted on the day of screening?</b></p>	<p>No. Parents who apply, submit the required documentation, and complete the eligibility interview will be notified by email of their child's acceptance beginning June 11, 2021.</p>

<b>Is it required for me to have my child's birth certificate for registration?</b>	Yes. Parents must submit the certified birth certificate. The mother's copy is not acceptable. A parent may also use the child's passport.
<b>Is it required for me to have my child's physical and shot record for registration?</b>	Yes. Immunizations must be on the Tennessee Certificate of Immunizations. The doctor must indicate that the child's immunizations are up-to-date. There is also a place on the form for the doctor to indicate that the child's physical is current.  If a child is accepted into the program, the child's immunizations and physical have to be current and up-to-date <u>PRIOR</u> to the child entering the classroom or participate virtually.
<b>Why do I have to provide my income?</b>	Head Start and Pre-K are needs-based programs. We are required to verify both the age of the child and the income for the family and household. Children are selected to participate in the program using the U. S. Federal Poverty Guidelines.
<b>I am probably over-income, should I apply?</b>	Any parent can apply to the program. Families who are over-income will be considered once all income-eligible children are placed. This usually does not occur until late September.
<b>How will I find out if my child has been accepted into the program?</b>	Parents will be notified by email if their child has been accepted into the program beginning June 11, 2021. Parents can also email <a href="mailto:prekregistration@scsk12.org">prekregistration@scsk12.org</a> to inquire about the application status.
<b>What schools still have space available for my child to attend?</b>	Parents are asked to select three school choices. There is a chance that there will not be an opening at the first school of your choice. If all selected choices are unavailable, your child will be placed on the waitlist for the first selected school.
<b>My child turns 4 in December. Can my child be screened for the 4-year-old category in December?</b>	No. Regardless of the application date, the child must have turned 4 by Aug. 15 of the current school year in order to be accepted into a 4-year-old classroom.
<b>Can I check on the status of my child's transfer?</b>	Contact the Early Childhood Office by calling (901) 416-3450 or email <a href="mailto:prekregistration@scsk12.org">prekregistration@scsk12.org</a> . Please allow up to 2 weeks before inquiring about your child's status.
<b>I cannot come to the screening. Can someone else bring my child to be screened?</b>	Eligibility interviews will occur by phone until further notice. Parents should schedule their interview around their schedules when possible.
<b>I live with someone else. Can I bring mail to the screening as proof of address?</b>	If you live with someone else, you will need to complete the <i>Shared Residence Affidavit</i> and have it notarized. You will also need to provide two pieces of mail that contain your name and the address in which you share. You can locate the <i>Shared Residence Affidavit</i> on the Shelby County Schools web page.

<b>How long will it take my child to come off the waitlist?</b>	When an opening becomes available, the next eligible child on the waitlist will be selected. There is no way to predict the time because placement is dependent upon an opening becoming available and the child's place on the waitlist.
<b>I have been accepted to the center or school of my choice. Do I have to notify the school my child is enrolled?</b>	No. Parents are not required to notify the school. The Early Childhood Department will notify all center directors, teachers and school administrators.
<b>I have been accepted to Pre-K and it says I have to attend an orientation. Will I have to go to the school?</b>	No. Teachers and the Family Service Workers will be working together to provide the orientation virtually. Parents will be expected to come to the school to pick up the remote learning manual and ticket for device pick up.
<b>Is transportation provided with the program?</b>	No. The parent is responsible for bringing the child to school and picking the child up from school.
<b>Will Pre-K Students receive devices?</b>	Yes, all Pre-K students who are enrolled in SCS Early Childhood Classroom, Community Partner Affiliate and Head Start classrooms will receive devices.
<b>What other resources will my student receive to support virtual learning?</b>	Each Pre-K student will receive a Remote Learning Resource Manual and Distance Learning Box that align with the virtual instruction that will be provided by the teachers and assistants. These tools will ensure students still receive high quality instruction and parents receive supports necessary to guide remote learning.
<b>Will Pre-K students be required to sit a computer all day during virtual learning?</b>	No. Pre-K teacher and teacher assistants will be logged on all day to support students and parents. We will provide Synchronous instruction which refers to instruction that is live and delivered real-time and Asynchronous instruction which refers to instruction that is recorded and/or completed with parents. Parents will be able to adjust the learning with some flexibility. We are asking all students to log in daily to be counted for attendance.
<b>Will Pre-K teachers and assistants be given the choice to work remotely?</b>	No. All staff members will have work remotely from classrooms.
